Administrative Reports -

Mayor: Nothing to report.

Village Administrator:

- Sawville has informed the VA that the PCA will be going up due to an unforeseen main transmission line problem causing power to be routed differently to the Village. <u>Council Member Philpot moved to increase the PCA Charge on resident's utility bill to .0055. Council Member VanHoose seconded. All present council members voted yea. Motion passed.</u>
- 111 North High Street had a water leak for a about a month and a half; problem has been resolved.
 Resident thanked the Village for notifying her of the leak. <u>Council Member Philpot moved to give a Sewer Credit to 111 North Hight Street in the amount of \$139.05. Council Member VanHoose seconded. All present council members voted yea. Motion passed.</u>
- Old generators are of no use any longer. They will begin forming a plan to bypass the switch gear in the substation this summer. There has been no interest on the old generators being buying as a whole, only for parts. The generators will be maintained until a decision has been made on what to do with them.
- Property & Liability Insurance will be over of \$50,000.00 therefore, it will need to be put out to bid.

Fiscal Officer:

- Council was given in packets the January Fund Reports and Bank Reconciliation which did reconcile. 1/2% Spreadsheet was also included in the packet.
- Collected so far is \$75,735.55 with \$18,933.89 that will go to the 1/4% line item for Capital Improvement
- Capital Projects Street Capital project is on hold at this time, until grant funding is further available.
- This year is the last year for partial building payments. Beginning next year full payments will be expected. Tax exemption forms have been filed.

Police Chief:

 Officer Angela Wood has put in her resignation letter, as she has taken a position with another entity with her last day being March 2, 2022. <u>Council Member Philpot moved to accept the resignation letter of</u> <u>Officer Angela Wood. Council Member Genovesi seconded.</u> All present council members voted yea. Motion passed.
