Some Village plans to share with you:

Serve Arcanum Day will be May 6th and hopefully we are blessed with beautiful weather for the event. The Flower Club has been contacted for their expertise in putting some color in the flower planters by the downtown parking lot. We were planning on repairing the downtown parking lot this year, but it looks like this project may be postponed until next year. If there is any way we can still accomplish it this year, we will. Stay tuned for further updates.

The grass is growing fast this time of year. A friendly reminder to all residents, please be sure to mow your grass regularly to prevent any violation postings. Remember not to blow grass clippings into the streets.

On May 12th at 6pm the Village will be holding their 4th public meeting for the CDBG Neighborhood Revitalization Grant. Resident participation is imperative. When submitting for grants, the projects that show high levels of resident participation/support during the planning process are highly favored. At the upcoming meeting, a final listing of projects for inclusion in the grant application and allocation of funds will be presented. So far for 2022, the Village has either submitted or is in the process of submitting for grants in excess of \$5 Million! If awarded these funds will be used towards the pool, various streets & alleys, parking lots and our park expansion. Many of the grants applied for by the Village, require matching fund dollars from the Village. These matching fund dollars are your tax dollars at work!!!!

The Village is acquiring some 50+ acres for our park expansion that will create paths through the woods and also through prairies to be used by the public, as well as, the school's crosscountry teams. It is a goal of mine to form a volunteer Park & Recreational Committee to help in the development of the new park addition and also with the overall maintenance of the parks. Due to natural causes, approximately 40 trees have had to be removed in the past several years. Planting new trees would be on the top of the agenda for the committee. Jim and Barb Deis have graciously done a lot for the park in the past and are willing to participate on the committee, however, they cannot do it alone. I am asking for volunteers to be part of this new Park & Recreational Committee for the Village of Arcanum. If anyone has any interest in serving on this committee, Please contact the Village office for more information. Any and all help will be appreciated.

A Message from Police Chief Ballinger

Ohio has made changes to some of their fireworks laws beginning July 1, 2022. Ohio residents can discharge consumergrade fireworks in Ohio either on their own property or another person's property with permission on certain holidays.

There are some recommendations I would like to pass on to our residents to help keep everyone safe this year and allow everyone to enjoy the fun.

Don't allow children to play with fireworks.
Set them off outside in a clear area, away from houses, dry leaves, and other flammable materials.
Wear safety glasses, which you should be able to pick up for free or a nominal

charge at a retailer.

Keep a bucket of water nearby in case of emergencies.
Don't try to relight or handle malfunctioning fireworks. Soak them with water and throw them away.

- Make sure other people are out of range before lighting them.
- While lighting it, don't have any part of your body over the firework.

• Store fireworks in a cool, dry place and keep unused products away from where you're igniting them.

• Don't light fireworks in a container, especially a glass or metal container.

• Don't experiment with homemade fireworks.

Light fireworks one at a time

• Never throw them at anyone and never carry them in your pocket.

Try to have fireworks done before midnight, and be courteous to your neighbors by letting them know ahead of time that you will be letting off fireworks and for how long. Please don't leave firework remnants all over your neighbor's yards. These remnants are dangerous to dogs and other domesticated and wild animals.

The Holidays that fireworks are allowed to be set off are New Year's Day, Chinese New Year, Cinco de Mayo, Memorial Day weekend, Juneteenth, July 3, 4, and 5, and the Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays before and after, Labor Day weekend, Diwali and New Year's Eve.

Enjoy your Spring and Summer, folks, and remember all of us together is what keeps this town safe and beautiful!
