<u>Call to Order</u> – Mayor Bonnie Millard opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance along with all present members of Council.

- Village Levy's Board of Elections has sent an official letter advising that the Park & Rec Levy and Police Protection Levy were both passed by voters.
- Grants Access Engineering has advised that the Village is able to submit for round two of the CDBG
 Critical Infrastructure Grant for East First Street. Application has to be turned into the Co. Commissioners
 by 12/9/22.
- Parks & Recreation Committee Committee has met with 2 nature specialists to help advise and educate the committee on the best way to preserve and utilize the park expansion land.
- Justin Hoke Mayor advised Council that instead of a variance through BZA an Encroachment Agreement through Council would be needed for Justin Hoke's property located at 10 S. Main Street, as well as, refunding Mr. Hoke a \$100.00 for his variance application. Council Member Boolman moved to refund Justin Hoke \$100.00 for his variance application for 10 South Main Street. - Residents Officers assisted a resident in finding a lost dog and the resident was extremely appreciative of the officer's help; Darke county resident, Mark Siert, made a donation to the PD in the amount of \$3,000.00.
- Several projects in the works for 2023.
- Traffic Light Traffic light equipment beginning to be ordered; Wagner paving will begin work shortly. The Village Utility Department will be contributing a good portion of in-kind labor to the project.

- Green Water Tower Currently draining the water tower; looking at ways to patch the leak.

Service and Leisure: Report given by Jacob Banks. Committee has cancelled all December meetings.

- Grants VA has submitted for reimbursement; just waiting on the check.
- Park & Rec Committee -
 - Pickleball courts Give Thanks Foundation is donating \$5k to the project; Eagle Fence has submitted an estimate of around \$5K for the fence repair.
 - o FY23 budget will be \$5K.
 - o Looking at having sponsorship signs made; VA will contact Wintrow Signs.
 - The 12 trees planted in the park this fall, will need to have mulch added at the base yet this year; Greg Brown is handling the plaque orders.
 - o Matt Gardner met with the Committee to discuss the park expansion land.
- Streets
 - o All the streets have been patched that were scheduled.
 - Utility Superintendent is requesting that Peewee Football and Garden Club remove their items from the Street Department is they are needing the room. Committee is looking for an alternate space for the 2 organizations.
 - o Access is quoting Albright Street; E. First Street grant is being reworked.
 - o Randy would like some paving done at the Utility Department.
- Violations Kollmeyer building needs to have a tax lien; Bonnie reported during Council Meeting that the process has already begun.
