Fall is slowly coming around the corner and the leaves are starting to drift downward. Prior to the seasonal leaf pickup, the Street Department has been busy painting and cleaning catch basins and prepping the basketball court for pickle ball. The Utility Department is wrapping up the 2400 to 7200 conversion project on Dull Road.

The Village is excited to have received word that the Critical Infrastructure Grant of \$470k has been awarded to us. With the reconstruction of East 1st Street and S. East Street next year, this grant will allow us to perform work on West South Street, along with S. Albright and Water streets for a total of \$1.3M (\$890k grant and a \$420k loan). The next streets to be fully constructed in the coming years will be a portion of South High, West 1st, and West 2nd as monies become available.

In regards to the grocery store, per the last conversation with the owner, he is still planning on opening, however, he wants to ensure all permits have been obtained prior to starting any work.

The Village Planning Committee has begun preliminary discussions on the Village pool. The Committee will meet periodically to discuss the pool, and encourages residents to attend to give community input. Planning Committee meetings will be posted on the Village Facebook page.

The Park Committee is happy to announce that Jenny Lanese as the winner of the Nature Preserve contest. She has won a \$20 gift certificate from Hustons' Restaurant. Clearing of the North woods for trails will begin this fall and winter, but is contingent on volunteers and the weather.

The last couple of weeks the Village has fielded many complaints on various issues, such as:

- Rumpke Waste has stated that they will not pick up trash cans that are too heavy to handle. Several did not get picked up last week due to being filled with dirt;
- Many complaints of dog waste not being picked up by the owners while out walking their pet. As pet owners it is your responsibility to take care of all dog waste. Please be considerate of other peoples' properties and the community green spaces;
- Concerns on teenagers speeding around the field house after practices and games, with the stop signs being ignored;
- An abundance of complaints have been received regarding the storage of recreational trailers, utility trailers and boats on properties. Village Ordinance states that such items, must be parked/stored to the rear of the house and be at least ten (10) feet from any lot line. Due to the number of these complaints', enforcement of the 10-foot rule will be enforced moving forward. For anyone that is currently in violation of this, please make the necessary corrections before a violation is given.

I'd like to thank everyone that came out for the 3rd Annual Purple Heart Ceremony. It is wonderful to see the ceremony growing each year, and tribute being paid to those that have received a Purple Heart.
