Town Hall meetings will begin at 6:30pm each night and will be held at the Village Administration Building in the Council Chambers.

With being awarded the OPWC -Clean Ohio Grant, coupled with the ODNR grant, Access Engineering has provided the Village with four different funding options for completion of the Nature Preserve, with the worst-case scenario being a 38% fund match from the Village. The Park and Recreation Committee will meet Thursday, Feb. 8th at 5pm in Council Chambers to discuss the best utilization of the funding.

Once better weather is upon us, the installation of the school crossing lights will begin, with the first ones being placed at Trojan Way and Sierra.

A new storage shed has been placed behind the Scout House, for the storage of the Scout supplies. The Scout House will then be cleaned and refreshed for residents to rent for special occasions. A big thank you to the Utility personnel for building the shed, costing only half of a purchased one.

### Tax Department Update

When completing the 2023 Village of Arcanum Income Tax Return, please remember to:

\*Sign your return.

\*Attach page 1 of your Federal 1040.

\*Include all W2's, 1099's and schedules.

\*Include your full payment.

All residents 18 and over residing within the Village corporation must file a tax return. If you retired in 2023, then you must file a final return. If you filed a final return previously and have no earned income, then you are not required to file.

Tax returns are available online or in the Administration Office. Online filing is available through the website @ www.villageofarcanum.com.
