<u>Call to Order</u> – President Pro-Tem Jerry L. Boolman opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance along with all present members of Council.

Roll Call – The following council members were present: Eric VanHoose, David Hartley, Jerry Boolman, Rick Genovesi, Ryan Burns and Tammy Bruner. <u>Meeting Minutes – Corrections and Approvals</u> – <u>Council Member VanHoose moved to approve the Meeting Minutes dated 1/30/2024. Council Member Hartley seconded. All present council members voted yea. Motion passed.</u>

Amendments to Agenda - Addition of Ordinance #2024-02; Resolution#2024-05

<u>Comments from the Public</u> – James Bennett introduced himself, and announced to Council that he was running for Darke Co. Prosecuting Attorney.

Administrative Reports -

Mayor: Not present.

Solicitor: Nothing to report.

Village Administrator/ Police Chief: Reports were provided in Council Packets.

Swearing in of Officer Robert Ladouceur by Council President Pro-Tem Jerry Boolman.

- Flock System- Company will be raising their yearly rates, Village can be locked into a 5-year contract for \$62,500. VA advised that the contract is paid out of the General Fund. VA stated that system maintenance/replacement/upgrades is all part of the contract. Council Member Hartley asked how often the system is utilized. VA stated that it aids the department every few months, but the benefits of having the system is astronomical and it is big deterrent for the community. Council Member Burns asked that in the provided Police Department report to Council, the reports start having a Flock incident tracking included. Council Member Genovesi moved to authorize the Village Administrator/Police Chief to enter into a 5-year contract with Flock Systems for \$62,500.00. Council Member Burns seconded. All present council members voted yea. Motion passed.
- Orval gears Last year one of the gears was repaired and has been working properly, however, the other gear is now improperly working. Repairs/rebuild of the gear will cost approximately \$8-9K. VA states that since the opening of the new sewer plant the Dodge Gears, have had nothing but consistent problems. VA would like to purchase a different, more reliable, brand of gears for \$22k for the Orval. The current gears could be parted out/used as a spare. This was not a budgeted expense for 2024, however, VA feels there is plenty of funding available in the Miscellaneous line-item to be able to purchase the two new gears. Council asked general questions on the life expectancy and general maintenance of the gears. Resident in attendance asked what the cost would be for replacement parts for the new gears. Council Member Hartley moved to authorize the Village Administrator to purchase 2 new Sumitomo gear boxes for the sewer plant in the amount of \$22,000 which includes installation. Council Member VanHoose seconded. All present council members voted yea. Motion passed.
