The volleyball court in Ivester park is being moved to the northeast corner of the park by the basketball courts. Also, the final plans for Ivester Park have been submitted for the Clean Ohio and ODNR grants. Plans include: paving the park streets and additional walking paths, installing a covered bridge and a service bridge in the park. This will be completed in 2025, and will be a beautiful addition to our wonderful park.

We wish to thank Kellie Eikenberry for the excellent job she performed this year as the Pool Manager. The pool itself has been disintegrating each year, causing damage to the sides that require patching annually. Unfortunately, the pool began leaking over 20k gallons a day, under the surrounding concrete of the pool.

The Village has been awarded an EPA grant of \$18k to close 6 old unused wells, but was not awarded the grant for a new water tower. The annual water sampling for lead and copper requested by Ohio EPA is currently being performed, and results will be announced once the testing has been completed.

The paving looks wonderful on West South Street, and the dreaded hump at the west end has been removed!!! The next street project involves East, E. First, and S. Albright Street, and will be completed before winter. We ask everyone to be alert and safe when traveling these streets during the reconstruction.

The school traffic light project has been delayed, and will be completed by Capital Electric as soon as possible. The stop signs on Trojan Ave. have been covered, but won't be removed for a while. I'm asking everyone to please be cautious during this change, so everyone stays safe.

The Finance Committee and Village Administration have begun the lengthy process of planning the budget for 2025, and hope to have it completed by November.

From signs, TV ads, meetings and discussions around kitchen tables, it is very evident that voting season is here! Be sure to check out your sample ballot on the Darke County Board of Elections website before heading to the voting booth. It is our right and privilege to vote. Take the necessary steps to get informed on all the issues.

The 4th Annual Veterans Purple Heart Ceremony will be on September 11th at 7 pm at the Arcanum VFW. The Village of Arcanum is the sole municipality in Darke County that honors Veterans that receive the Purple Heart. Please come out and support our Veterans, or participate in the Golf cart parade, starting at 6:45 from Family Dollar to East South Street and down South Albright to the VFW.
