Let's begin to think positively. With this last blast of cold weather and snow, spring showers and blooming flowers should be here soon! If only we could just skip to May and 75-degree weather, that would be fantastic.

I hope everyone is as excited as I am for the park expansion work to be completed. I cannot wait to see the addition of the beautiful bridges and new walkways throughout our park. It seems it has taken so long to get this project to this stage, but when you consider it began as a dream, first acquiring the land along with all the grant paperwork and approvals through Clean Ohio and ODNR, and then you have the bidding and finally the construction. The labor of all this takes time to reach fruition.

The contractor for the First Street Project has plans beginning around March 1st, to remove the remaining curb, asphalt, and sidewalk. And in April (weather permitting) will be laying the base asphalt, final milling, and overlay of the streets. Another successful street project will then be completed! Other than preventative maintenance on roads, there will be no other significant street construction until 2026 with the South High Reconstruction project, that also includes the ballpark and downtown parking lots.

An electric increase went into effect on February 28th and will be reflected on your March bill. The Distribution Charge is increasing from .03305 to .03430 per kilowatt, with an additional \$2 residential customer charge, which amounts to an approximate average of \$4/month increase. However, a significant increase will be seen in the PCA (Power Cost Adjustment), that the Village has structured to fluctuate automatically to control over or under-usage of power costs from previous periods based on actual cost vs. projected cost for the period, generally adjusting every six months or as needed. Any over-collected funds from other periods are returned to the customers as a credit. The current PCA is negative \$-.0020 and will adjust to a positive \$0.00650. The combined total of increase is 8.6%. Another increase is expected in July. A bill based on an average consumption of 1000 kilowatt hours will see a monthly increase of \$11.75.

The Villages' latest bill from AMP increased by \$41k due to customer demand in the last month and rising energy costs. The Village strives to protect the customers' energy costs, and when compared to AES and Darke Rural Electric, we are still favorable to their rates and fees, and still have one of the lowest power rates in the area.

We understand that rising rates affect every household budget, and we continually strive to keep rates manageable. As mentioned in February's newsletter, AMP is proposing a Smart Thermostat Monitoring Program to aid in energy conservation for our residents. More info will be forthcoming on this program. If you have any questions regarding electric costs or the thermostat program, please reach out to Village Administrator/Chief of Police Marcus Ballinger.



*Include all W2's, 1099's and schedules

*Include your full payment.

All residents 18 and over residing within the Village corporation must file a tax return. If you retired in 2024, then you must file a final return.

Arcanum does not give credit for other city taxes withheld.

Taxes can be filed through the mail, brought into the office or through our website.

The Village Tax Department will no longer be filling out
