What I can say for sure about April, is that it always brings out roaming cats. Three strays, so far, have been delivered to the Humane Society for neutering. The Village has seven traps available, for anyone willing to help with the cat situation. Please call for a trap to be placed at your residence. Volunteers are always needed.

Several residents have signed up for the Smart Energy Thermostat program being offered by AMP. With the peak summer months of hot AC weather approaching, this optional program may be something to consider. For more information, please contact the Village Administrator.

I wish to convey my deepest apologies for any and all hardships that residents have suffered during the ongoing East/First/Albright Street construction project. Communication from the contractor to the residents has been unsatisfactory during the entire project. I can assure you that the next Village project will be handled much differently. The project will be very nice once completed, however, no pain – no gain does not go far with the residents that have shared their concerns, pains, and inconveniences with me.

The last major street project coming in 2026 was awarded thru the Neighborhood Revitalization Grant and OPWC (South High Street/Downtown/Baseball Parking lots) for \$1.7M. I am proud to mention that the Village is the first to receive such a grant in Darke County. There will be no Village match dollars required, however, there will be a \$14k annual payment over the next 30 years.

NOTICES/REMINDERS:

The grant for the splash pad in Ivester Park was not approved.

Trash/garbage cans – Village Ord. 20-26 states, "No garbage cans shall be stored in front of a residence or commercial business." Receptacles may be put out a day in advance, but MUST be removed the next day. It is the resident's responsibility to contact Rumpke for a large item pickup, and to properly wrap the item before setting at the curb for Rumpke to remove. Early Bird newspapers – It is the residents' responsibility to dispose of these papers promptly. With the rains and windy conditions, they are getting into the catch basins and causing drainage issues.

All dog owners need to be responsible and courteous to all residents, by picking up and properly disposing of all dog waste while out in the community.

Permits must be obtained prior to any home improvement projects to beautify your property such as installing patios, fences, sheds etc. Also be sure to call 811 before you dig. There are several older shed and buildings around the community that need immediate attention under the Villages' Property Maintenance Ordinance. Taking measures early will prevent a violation.

While students are out beautifying the community this day, please be extra cautious while driving through the Village, as the students will be walking. <u>Additionally, Ivester Park will be closed from 11-3pm for the Arcanum High School's Spring Fling.</u>
