

I can't believe it's August already!! July was here and gone in a blink of an eye. August will probably fly by just as fast, with the Brick Street Block Party August 1st and 2nd, followed by the Tour de Darke cyclists coming through on August 3rd, The Great Darke County Fair August 15-23, and then school beginning on August 26th!

The Park Expansion in Ivester Park is finally completed, and WOW does it look wonderful! Only a few tasks remain, such as signage for the paths and some finishing touches on the bridges. We encourage everyone to visit and walk through the park and enjoy a hike through the Nature Preserve. The volleyball court relocation is also completed with the lighting still to be installed. We wish to thank Calli Means and her crew for volunteering to repaint the pickleball courts at the ballpark with a new anti-slip paint designed specifically for athletic play.

The swimming pool has been running smoothly this year with no major issues. Attendance has been very good, with very few days being closed due to inclement weather. We will have a better understanding in August of how the overall pools' success was this year once all the numbers are calculated. We know there has been some frustration with the shortened season and pool hours and other complaints shared on Facebook, however, when the attendance was looked at from the previous year everyone would understand why the decisions were made to close at the end of July. The attendance the last few years in August couldn't compensate for the chlorine and staff expense. Next year could be a different story, but it is necessary for residents to speak to one another and pass on the importance of passing vs. not passing the 1.75 mill levy that will appear on Novembers' ballot. It is critical for the community to understand that this levy subsidizes the General Fund to continue providing the services that are currently available, such as: Police and Fire protection, general street repair and paving, winter salting and plowing, maintenance of parks, leaf and limb pickup, street sweeping, and recreational amenities. As I mentioned in June newsletter, our Village is the only town/village in Darke County that does not have a levy to help offset General Fund expenses.

We are pleased to announce that an ordinance has been passed establishing a partnership between the Village and the Preservation Society, continuing to fully support their restoration process until such time there is an avenue for complete ownership of the Old Town Hall by the Society. The Village is proud to continue this endeavor and anxious to see their progress.

The next major street project will be the reconstruction of South High St, which will also include the resurfacing of the ballpark and downtown parking lots. This project is scheduled to be bid out this fall with work to begin in spring of 2026 with completion scheduled for fall of 2026. The Village also has begun general discussions for the brick streets renovation in the next 4-5 years.

This year's Purple Heart Ceremony will be on Sept 11th, honoring all veterans, past and present who have received a Purple Heart. We would love to see the parade route lined with residents for the golf cart parade. More information regarding the event will be posted on Facebook and in the September newsletter.
